CNR-DSSTTA is participating in Belmont Forum 2020 Collaborative Research Action *Towards Sustainability of Soils* and Groundwater for Society.

Available funding:

Depending on all conditions of eligibility and peer review being met, the total budget earmarked by CNR-DSSTTA for this call will be up to a total of **150.000,00 €** for the whole CRA. Funding for each approved project cannot exceed 80.000,00 €.

An up to one year no-cost extension may be possible upon request by the partner to CNR-DSSTTA with clear justification. CNR-DSSTTA will assess such requests and decide to grant or not such an extension and its length (with a maximum of one year).

CNR-DSSTTA contribution to the CRA requires co-funding by the granted Italian groups through an in-kind contribution of 50% of the funded amount.

On top of the financial support, CNR-DSSTTA will also support the CRA:

- through the help brought to project PI of all countries to identify Italian partners (research, stakeholders) and construct the consortia and research proposal;

- through the access to available infrastructures, at the cost reserved to CNR-DSSTTA employees, in the field of the CRA. This includes, for example, Critical Zone observatories, geochemical and isotopic laboratories and ecological laboratories managed by CNR DSSTTA. Other infrastructures and research platforms, at national and international levels, may also be accessible upon request.

CNR-DSSTTA standard eligibility criteria for research projects apply. If applicants have any questions about their eligibility, they are advised to contact antonello.provenzale@cnr.it to enquire about their eligibility for the call before developing the proposal.

Eligibility

Research consortia should clearly indicate in their proposal outcomes how the project can improve the understanding of the complex relationships between Critical Zone, soils and groundwater systems. Proposals should include applications to sustainability of soils and groundwater systems, to decision-making processes and conservation practices. Particular attention will be given to proposals dealing with sustainability in protected areas (national or regional parks, protected sites, etc). Candidates should contact as early as possible Antonello Provenzale (see below) that will connect them with national research organizations.

The intention of requesting support from Italian in-situ and/or laboratory infrastructures has to be declared as soon as possible. Note that the access to the sites and laboratories is subjected to the availability at requested time and the agreement with the leader of the research infrastructure/laboratory.

An up to one year no-cost extension may be possible upon request by the partner to his/her funding agency with clear justification. The appropriate funding agencies will assess such requests and decide to grant or not such an extension and its length (with a maximum of one year).
