Duration of time:	3 years
Country/(ies) supported	Uruguay
Description/qualifications of eligible participants	Applicants must be from public and/or private non-profit institutions whose activities include research. If there is more than one research group in the same project, and they belong to different institutions, they must select which will be the proposing institution for the project. The proposing institution will sign the financing contract with ANII (in case of approval of the project) and thus will receive the funding. The Principal Investigator of the project for Uruguay must belong to the proposing institution . The rest of the Uruguayan participating institutions may belong to the categories established by the call: Fully Self-Financed (receives no funds or in-kind support from a CRA funding agency) Stakeholder Organizations.
Stipulations for the maximum number of researchers in the consortium	No limit
Type of contribution + amount of contribution (K€)	USD 100.000 equivalent in Euros
Maximum amount that can be requested per project or by researcher (K€)	USD 50.000 equivalent in Euros, per project
Restrictions for use of funds	The funds to be provided by ANII may be allocated to the following items: 1. Training. 2. Dissemination. Expenses associated with activities whose purpose is to communicate the knowledge acquired to a broad non-specialized public. Modalities and styles of communication accessible to those who do not know about the specific subject will be sought, aiming to promoting dialogues with different social sectors and contributing to the processes of democratization and social appropriation of knowledge. 3. Laboratory equipment.



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- 4. Administration expenses (maximum 5% of the total budget contributed by ANII).
- 5. Contingencies (maximum 5% of the total budget contributed by ANII).
- 6. Materials and supplies.
- 7. Other equipment.
- 8. Air tickets.
- 9. Technical Staff. The incremental costs of researchers' dedication to the project or the incorporation of new researchers to meet the project's objectives will be financed. The costs associated to technical or support staff will only be accepted when their participation is clearly defined and justified based on the proposed objectives and work plan. Researchers who are beneficiaries of an ANII scholarship whose activities coincide with those expected to be carried out in the project, may not request additional funding to cover their dedication to those activities (in case of non-compliance the project will be considered ineligible). Fees will be recognized according to ANII's guideline of maximum recognizable fees for researchers and technical support personnel (available on the ANII website). 10. Visiting professors. Economic support will be recognized for the development of activities such as the teaching of courses, seminars and conferences during stays at Uruguav.
- 11. Promotion and dissemination.
 Expenses such as registration fees for congresses, dissemination material and supplies destined to academic events may be included.
- 12. Protection of intellectual property rights.
- 13. Services.
- 14. Software and Licenses.
- 15. Travel and lodging: Food, lodging and local transportation of the team members and visiting professors will be financed only for activities related to the project or to the presentation of its results. Expenses will be recognized according to ANII's guide for budgeting travel expenses of R&D projects (available on the ANII website).



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	All expenses must be associated with the activities developed in the project.
	The acquisition of vehicles or land will not be financed.
Specific themes within the call	Projects will be considered in the three lines of the call without restrictions. It will be valued that the projects include topics related to the National Health Adaptation Plan under development by the Public Health Ministry.

[Additional information]	1. All researchers based in Uruguayan institutions must have an updated CVuy.
	2. A letter of endorsement from the Uruguayan proposing institution as well as from the other Uruguayan institutions participating in the project must be sent to ANII (see model available on the ANII website).
	3) No member of the research team based in a Uruguayan institution may exceed 60 hours per week considering all the work activities in which they perform (including teaching hours or other public or private jobs).
	4) The approval of the Ethics Committee must be obtained for the projects in which it may correspond.
	5) All works resulting from or related to the selected projects must be deposited in the open access digital repository of the corresponding proposing institution in Uruguay or in the institutional repository of ANII, as established in the ANII Open Access Regulation (see: https://www.anii.org.uy/institucional/documentos-de-interes/30/reglamento-de-acceso-abierto/).
	The results of the investigation will be compiled in a final technical report to be presented to ANII. Part of this report will be published in REDI (redi.anii.org.uy), the ANII institutional repository.



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6) Applications in which, at the closing date of the call, the Uruguayan Principal Investigator is in a situation of non-compliance with any of ANII's programs will not be accepted.
