





Sustainable urban development solutions


GIZ and ICLEI (2014) 'Operationalizing the Urban NEXUS':

- An Urban NEXUS solution integrates two or more systems, services, policy or operational 'silos'
- Guide stakeholders to identify and pursue possible synergies between sectors, jurisdictions, and technical domains
- Increase institutional performance, optimize resource management, and service quality
